What we are doing: We would like to invite students to share their reading by participating in an online share. The app, **Seesaw**, will be used as a digital platform to share your summer reading with other students in your grade level. You can do this



on a sandy beach or under a tree in the backyard, we all have places that we love to read our favorite books, explore something new or spark curiosity. *The Seesaw app is a way to share the reading we are doing over the summer. However, you can choose to take/print a picture, make a drawing, write a letter, etc. to be shared with your classmates when you return to school instead of using Seesaw.*

When we are doing it: All summer long! Check out the calendar for a list of fun ideas to get you started! The activities on the calendar are only SUGGESTED items and are NOT mandatory. Dates are included on the calendar.

Getting Started with Seesaw - Grade 5

Step 1

For classroom/home use only. Do **NOT** post this information on social media.

Download the Seesaw CLASS app to your phone or mobile device.

Important Note:

• You may already have the Seesaw FAMILY app downloaded. However, it is important to note that in order to share your Summer Adventures with other friends in your grade, you **MUST** download the Seesaw CLASS app.

Step 2

Open the Seesaw CLASS app on your phone or mobile device or go to <u>https://app.seesaw.me</u> on your computer. (the initial visit to Seesaw must be done through a mobile device).

Choose, "I'm a student" and scan the QR code for the grade you will be ENTERING in the fall. To adhere to RSD 13 District Acceptable Use Policy and for the safety of our students, the QR codes are unique to our private groups and are NOT ALLOWED to be shared on social media.

Pick your child's name from the list of students in the grade level.

NOTE: You will only need to choose your child's name the first time **You login**.
