Atwell - The Atwell Memorial Scholarship Fund (in memory of Bishop R. & Mabel Trischman Atwell)	At least a B- average in grades 11 & 12; Accepted at an accredited 4-year college; Evidence of varied community service. Some basis for need or financial assistance (<u>preferential consideration</u> to a direct descendent of the family)
Baruschke Memorial Scholarship	Student who is a "B" student and preferably a language major and/or a student attending a technical school with an interest in carpentry or architecture.
Breese - Patricia W. Breese Memorial	Graduating senior planning to become a special education teacher
Brewster Korn PTA	Attended B/K; Demonstrated financial need; Class rank not important; Involved in school/community service; Extra curricular activities; Interest in teaching and education; Pursuing a degree working with children
Bryant - Julia C. Bryant	Interest in music or elementary education; Financial need is important
Burnham - Ester G. Burnham Memorial	No special restrictions; Possible interest in education
Coe - Sydney A. Coe Memorial	Medical field (primarily pediatrics) or nursing
Curtis - Gregory Curtis Memorial Fund	Interest in public service, government and/or environment
Durham Cooperative Nursery School	Recipient selected by Ms. Lainey Melvin, must have attended the Durham Co-op
Durham Garden Club	Durham boy or girl; Field of environmental studies, horticulture, landscape design
Durham Basketball Association	One girl and one boy basketball varsity player with strong academic performance; a strong role model

Durham Woman's Club	Recipient selected by Women's Club members, Durham resident, involved in school/community activities; student in good academic standing.
Eagleson - J. Bruce Eagleson Memorial Scholarship	1 boy and 1 girl recipient. Must have played at least one varsity sport; Maintained an overall B average
Ellmers - Paul H. Ellmers Memorial	Boy interested in electronics or automotive work attending college or trade school
Ferretti - Dom Ferretti Community Service Award	Community service; Preferably Middlefield resident
Glidden - Robert J Glidden Memorial Fund	Anyone entering into ROTC program. Student pursuing studies in criminal justice or law enforcement

Kupcho Scholarship	Senior with excellence in mathematics or pursuing higher education in the area of mathematics
Lino's Market Scholarship Award	Interested in culinary studies or business or entrepreneurship.

Patrician - Kenneth M. Patrician DMD Scholarship	Awarded to a graduating senior who is going on to college. Given to a good student not necessarily an outstanding student, who is not receiving any other awards.

Pecor - Teddy Pecor Memorial	Hard working student with definite college goals, a good sense of humor is a consideration. Must have financial need.
Pernel - Elizabeth Mary Pernel Memorial	Student who best exemplifies the following: determination, dedication, integrity, courtesy and sensitivity.
Preisner-Pedersen Memorial Scholarship	Student pursuing studies in the building trades (engineering, architecture, etc.)

Spatuzzi - Mark Spatuzzi Appreciation Award	Primary consideration is financial need
Stannard - Elwin L Stannard American Legion Post 184 Durham	Financial need, interest in government or political science. Special consideration for family background in military service.
Strong School Parent Organization	Pursuing studies in science/technology. Has shown excellence during high school. Attended Strong school for both 7 th & 8 th grades. Financial need not a consideration
Taylor - Mary and J. Richard Taylor	Scholarship may not have been the best but demonstrates likelihood to profit from continuing education. Look for strong recommendation from guidance dept.
Thompson-Lillian and Ward Thompson Memorial Scholarship	Durham student who best demonstrates his/her love for Durham—volunteers in school and civic activities, plans on furthering their education
Torrison Stone and Garden “Triple Threat Sports Award”	Student that participates in three sports who excels in the the classroom as well as in the athletic arena. Able to balance both areas successfully.
Tucker - Andrea Bradley Tucker Memorial	Interest in working with/helping special needs children; preference given to a student who is going into the field of special education, social work or nursing.
Washington Trail 10K	Member of cross-country. Demonstrates leadership qualities, community service.
White (Edith White Memorial) - Durham Volunteer Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary	Medicine, health, agriculture, communications. Financial need important.
Willett -Leo and Dorothy Willett Award	Durham boy or girl with real financial need, a firm commitment to a 4 year program and who has demonstrated great potential in any field.
