Readers' Workshop is an instructional model that focuses on the work of the reader. This model balances direct instruction, guided practice and independent practice. Students will have opportunities to self-select books and read a variety of text.

What will my child learn?

- To apply decoding skills to read accurately
- To develop and monitor comprehension skills
- To read fluently
- To read a variety of genres
- To work collaboratively with peers to explain their thinking

CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION & ASSESSMENT Word Study



In grades K-2 our word study program is based on Fundations. Fundations is a systematic program in the foundational skills for reading and spelling. Each lesson consists of a variety of lesson activities that keep students engaged and learning.

What will my child learn?

- To identify sounds of letters
- To write letters correctly
- To segment and blend sounds in words
- To learn the explicit rules for phonics
- To read multisyllabic words
- To read and spell high frequency words correctly
